



ÉLOGE DE L'AIR (IN PRAISE OF AIR) **@MONT DES ARTS**

To be kinetic without a motor, sonorous without a sound system, interactive without technical overkill - this was the challenge taken up in creating the Éloge de l'Air. This innovative co-production between Quebec and Europe is based on the principle of inventing an installation dedicated to intercontinental travel and collaboration. It symbolises travel and embodies the idea of movement.

Éloge de l'Air is set on 9 flagpoles, each embellished with a transparent flag which reflects gold. It invites the audience to sway to activate the lights on either side of the swings, with a very special atmosphere (particularly at night).

This sober, minimal installation has been installed at the Mont des Arts, following a stint at the Constellations international festival in Metz. It will then end the year 2024 in Montreal.

Founded in 2007, Chevalvert is a visual design studio based in Paris. The studio's uniqueness lies in its object-oriented, systemic approach to images, where the process counts as much as the result. The studio's work covers graphic design, interaction, publishing, video and spatial and interactive installations. The installations are winners of several European awards and travel to many countries.

AFTER SKI EVENINGS ON THE ICE @ DE BROUCKÈRE

On Thursdays, A DJ set will keep skating fans entertained on Place De Brouckère from 6 pm to 10 pm, with a programme which reflects Brussels' diversity of promoters and musical styles. In this way, groups with an established reputation are brought to the fore, alternating with other emerging groups.

What's more, the Winter Wonders ice rink includes a larger area dedicated to toddlers, three curling lanes and a terrace, so you can enjoy the atmosphere of Place De Brouckère right beside the ice.

To round off the event in style, a Disco on Ice evening is being organised on the ice rink on Saturday 6 January 2024 from 6 pm to 10 pm.

The Dream Space is moving a stone's throw away from the ice rink, and was present in Place de la Monnaie last year. Alongside it is a brand-new attraction this year, Santa's Reindeer, where you can take a ride on a reindeer!

TOUR NOIRE. THE PLACE TO BE FOR CHILDREN

Wednesday is the "half day," and it's kids' time with Afterschool! Storytelling, mascots, street art and a host of other surprises await you at the Enchanted House at the Tour Noire. On Sundays, Magic Sundays are filled with wonder with performances by passionate magicians. Winter Vox is also back at weekends: groups (three on Saturday and three on Sunday) offer recitals: Christmas carols, gospel, sacred songs, pop and contemporary.

WORLD MUSIC @ DE BROUCKÈRE

Every Tuesday, Place De Brouckère is brightened up by a series of musical strolls which weave their way through the streets. There's something for everyone, with brass bands of different styles each week: Indian, Balkan, Latin, African, Arabic, and more. The closing evening is hosted by Belgian Krewe on 2 January.

VISUAL

As every year, we're calling on a new artist to bring a (very) personal touch to the event. This year's Winter Wonders poster features the colours and style of Brussels-based illustrator Elzo Durt.

Born in 1980, this graphic designer and illustrator from Brussels creates his images from engravings, drawings and textures, which he scans from books he finds anywhere and everywhere. He then composes, deconstructs, restructures and colours his images, (which are somewhere between surrealism and pop art) always in flashy colours.

His compositions feature fantastic characters, straight out of a dream. This faraway winter wonderland allows the collective imagination to be inspired... the emblematic characters of Winter Wonders are represented here to form an unusual and joyful timeless family.



4. A GUEST OF HONOUR: THE 11 INDIGENOUS **NATIONS OF QUEBEC**

At the invitation of the City of Brussels, the 11 Indigenous Nations of Quebec are being honoured at Winter Wonders, which welcomed some 3.5 million visitors in 2022 with significant economic spin-offs for the capital.

Welcoming the First Nations and Inuit to the Belgian capital represents a unique economic, tourism and cultural opportunity. In addition, their visit is helping to raise the profile of Brussels and Winter Wonders internationally, and is also a fantastic showcase for Quebec as a travel destination. Last June, the Quebec government announced a partnership with the City of Brussels "to develop and highlight Indigenous," with a view to the 2023 edition of Winter Wonders organised by Brussels Major Events.

For thousands of years, Indigenous Quebec has been distinguished by its rich historical culture, which combines ancestral and now contemporary traditions in a highly-sought-after, quality tourism offer marked by its authenticity.

For more than 30 years, Tourisme Autochtone Québec (TAQ) has invited the public to discover all it has to offer: experiences based on the protective values of our culture and heritage, combining art, culture, nature and adventure. All the activities are based on the fantastic heritage of the Indigenous peoples of Quebec, allowing the greatest number of people come and share exceptional, warm and simply unforgettable moments in a magnificent setting.

This transatlantic collaboration has resulted in a rich and varied programme throughout the five weeks of the event. As announced by the Quebec government, "A Shaputuan, a large traditional Indigenous tent, will be erected for the duration of the event. This

installation is the focal point of the event produced by TAQ. Activities to promote Indigenous tourism in Quebec will include workshops, cultural conferences and screenings of short films and videos on Indigenous realities, languages, culture, literature and tourism experiences."

The programme also takes into account the sustainable dimension of the event, offering an experience which is as responsible and authentic as possible while opening up to the Indigenous communities who have come to share their heritage with the public.

5. THE WORLD'S MOST BEAUTIFUL SQUARE IN GRANDIOSE STYLE

THE CHRISTMAS TREE

If there's one thing which truly symbolises the spirit of Winter Wonders, it has to be its famous tree. The latter will be enthroned alongside the traditional nativity scene at the centre of the sound and light show in the Grand-Place.

Cut down on Wednesday 15 November in Duffel, the conifer will be erected on the Grand-Place on Thursday 16 November from 6 am. It will be adorned with strong symbols representative of certain nations (a star, an inukshuk, snowshoes and a dream catcher), carved in wood and created by Pascal Sioui, among others. It will come to life for the very first time on Friday 24 November during the inauguration ceremony starting at 6 pm.

THE JAZZED-UP COURTYARD OF THE TOWN HALL Sacred Journey

A renowned traditional Anishinaabe artist, Frank Polson is responsible for the work in the courtyard of the Town Hall. Strongly influenced by his childhood (when he went hunting and trapping with his father), Frank Polson reproduces a natural world where loons, wolves, eagles and other wildlife abound. Anxious to preserve and promote his traditions, the painter also draws on his rich ancestral culture to choose his themes. He sees his art as a method of healing for all future generations.

With Sacred Journey, he wants to convey the message that "each and every one of us has a sacred path to walk to ensure that our culture and our way of life remain strong."



6. A WELCOMING CHRISTMAS MARKET

Offering a perfect balance between tradition and modernity, the Winter Wonders Christmas market in the heart of Brussels remains one of the most popular in Europe (source: European Best Destination, European Best Christmas Market).

For five weeks, about 250 traders will ravish the eyes of the curious and tantalise the taste buds of gourmets. Here you can taste world cuisine and find a gift for someone special (or treat yourself!). The activities taking place on Place De Brouckère, de la Monnaie and Grand-Place will be extended until Sunday 7 January.

The market takes on an even more magical appearance at dusk!

THE VISMET AND PLACE SAINTE-CATHERINE

This is where most of the chalets are concentrated. They offer all sorts of sweet and savoury foods, and gifts which are each more original than the last! Between purchases, visitors can enjoy numerous activities such as the Ferris Wheel, Andréa's marrygo-round rides and much more.

The beauty of Saint Catherine's Church, recently renovated by Beliris, has had its beauty enhanced by illumination from 5 pm to 11 pm.

PLACE DE LA BOURSE

The beautiful square is once again illuminated at the front and back with numerous chalets offering all kinds of dishes.

Indigenous Quebec is taking part in the festivities as the guest of honour at Winter Wonders. Combining ancestral and contemporary traditions, the rich culture of these peoples can be discovered at Place de la Bourse - Rue Auguste Orts.

PLACE DE LA MONNAIE

Place la Monnaie is hosting chalets offering typical mountain food and drink along with a wide range of sweets and other treats to delight those with a sweet tooth.

COMMON COVERED TERRACES

The common covered terraces are the meeting point of the walk with protected, equipped and lit areas offering visitors a special moment of relaxation in a welcoming environment.

7. OTHER WONDERS

PLACE DE BROUCKÈRE

Place De Brouckère has been a pedestrian area for several years, and will host the ice rink and the curling rinks as well as numerous catering chalets and covered terraces to create a warm and friendly mini village. Here, the traders are for the second time using reusable tableware, again participating in a test which augments the ever-increasing existing sustainability measures. This initiative is being extended to Place de la Monnaie and Place de la Bourse this year.

THE TOUR NOIRE

Located behind the Saint Catherine's Church, the Tour Noire is one of the best-conserved relics of the first fortifications of Brussels constructed at the start of the 13th century.

On a stage in the shape of an igloo, the spellbinding voices of the Winter Vox choirs will ring out one after the other, amplifying the magic of this hidden treasure location.

For the first time the Tour Noire will host the Enchanted House, where children are the kings and queens of the party.

Quebec is once again well represented with preparations based on maple syrup and other characteristic products with their inimitable taste, including the legendary Poutine, a more-typical Quebec dish composed of fries, cheese curds and brown sauce.

WINTER WONDERS CRAFTS

The City of Brussels is keen to ensure that craftspeople from Brussels and beyond benefit from the Winter Wonders commercial showcase.

This year, no less than 30 chalets will display the label with the distinctive sign of the "craftspersonproducers." They meet certain quality criteria to obtain this Winter Wonders label (such as the origin of the products).

THE STELLA ARTOIS PAVILION, A **CHRISTMAS MARKET MUST-VISIT!**

In the heart of Winter Wonders, on the Vismet, the Stella Artois Pavilion welcomes visitors in an attractive atmosphere and invites them to take the time to savour this local beer during a visit which has become a must.



BRUSSELS BY LIGHTS

From the centre of Brussels to Neder-Over-Heembeek. via Haren and Laeken, the capital is aglow with lights in the streets and shopping streets. Each year Brussels reveals itself in a show of new light creations in all shapes and forms: snowflakes, geometric jellyfish, snowmen and much more.

Since 2013, it has become one of the best habits of the City of Brussels to illuminate ever more and more of the capital's streets and commercial thoroughfares (both literally and figuratively). This year, the eleventh edition features no less than 168, including 8 new ones.

This extension is justified by the constant desire to support the commercial activities of the city's neighbourhoods - which are also involved in the decisions concerning the illuminations which concern them. The decorations are chosen in close collaboration with the various traders' associations in each district.



In addition, the city centre is becoming the playground for a unique artistic experience combining digital and physical art to host a geocaching trail.

ACTIVITIES FOR CHILDREN

Inside the Enchanted House, ears prick up and eyes open wide as tales and other delights create a magical atmosphere in the dreamy setting of this double chalet.

Wednesday is the "half day," and it's kids' time with Afterschool! Storytelling, mascots, street art and a host of other surprises await you at the Enchanted House near the Tour Noire.

On Sundays, Magic Sundays are filled with wonder with performances by passionate magicians.

BABY CORNER

This little cocoon is available at the Bourse, near the Belgian Beer World gift shop. It allows families to change their baby and warm up their bottle or a meal in peace and quiet.

Don't miss out on any of the (winter) wonders: these five weeks will also allow you to take advantage of the extremely rich cultural offer proposed in the city centre.

CENTRALE FOR CONTEMPORARY ART

The group exhibition "l'Art de Rien" (the art of nothing) brings together artists, mostly from Brussels, who share a talent for the smallest gesture and a predilection for humble materials: for aesthetic and poetic purposes, they reuse and divert poor materials or restore dignity to ordinary, everyday objects the kind that are discarded once consumed in the household chaos of the modern world.

The timeless strangeness which emanates from Antoinette d'Ansembourg's installations is drawn from the territory of the city, where new building sites spring up daily. In these areas which are off-limits to the public and of uncertain temporalitý, the artist reveals the connections between rubble and plants which are able to grow in hostile environments.

In "A Bread in the Wall", Sofhie Mavroudis questions the notion of transmission, particularly through language and tradition.

Starting from an incomplete knowledge of her paternal language, she uses gesture to initiate a change of state and gives the different objects she creates a symbolism of their own.


SANTA'S REINDEER

This attraction has already proved very popular at many Christmas markets, and is a big hit with children.



12. THE CITY ACTS



The City of Brussels is clearly demonstrating its commitment to sustainability.

For several years now, the non-profit Brussels Major Events has been exploring various ways of making the events it organises as sustainable as possible.

Many actions have already been carried out to further this goal, some for several years and others for the very first time.

- Use of LED bulbs for the Winter Wonders illuminations
- Since 2016, reusable cups have been used throughout the market
- into a work of art, transformation into benches and tables by a Belgian craftsman, transformation into trophies for the BXL TOUR and decoration by Brussels artists)
- the consumption of electric heaters inside chalets has been limited
- Since 2021, no more heaters on the terraces
- Reduction of street lighting hours: from 5 pm to 1 am (instead of 1 pm to 1 am)
- New in 2023: the City of Brussels is developing its own reusable dishware supply chain and will be 1¢ providing the merchants of the Place De Brouckère, Place de la Monnaie and Place de la Bourse (excluding specific formats)
- Setting up a system for the recovery, redistribution and re-use of surplus food from the market
- Waste sorting for traders
- Plastic Metals Cardboard sorting reinforced and improved for the public
- Highlighting of the label for craftspeople participating in the Christmas market
- Study and reinforcement of a specific mobility plan for the period of the event
- Specific facilities for PRM 16
- Establishment of a family reception area, the Baby Corner
- Since 2022, addition of new technology "dry" toilets on Place De Brouckère
- Collaborations with ever more artists, associations, Brussels and Belgian organisations
- Support for the campaign against street harassment
- Reinforcement of the cleaning teams of the City of Brussels 16
- 16 (toilets, tables, snack stands, etc.).

A study and analysis is underway to continue the research and ensure the progressive implementation of new measures.

Creation of a "Happy Team" which ensures that the infrastructure of the event site is as clean as possible

MOBILITY, A CRUCIAL CONCERN DURING Winter Wonders

Several measures are implemented in order to harmonise the interaction of the flows within and around the event.

Brussels Central Station is strategically located in the city center. It is therefore highly recommended to use public transport to get to the event, thus avoiding the major construction sites underway in and around Brussels during this busy end-of-year period.

During the weekend, return train services (from Friday at 7 pm to Sunday) benefit from a reduction of 50%. What's more, the SNCB is offering a special Winter Wonders ticket at half price during the school holidays. Train users can also access station car parks at a reduced rate.

The numerous public transport links serving Winter Wonders are a major asset in terms of accessibility. From the STIB stations Gare Centrale, Bourse and De Brouckère stations, visitors can reach the heart of the event via metro lines 1 and 5, trams 3 and 4, and multiple bus lines.

The bicycle remains the easiest and most flexible means of transport. Cycle parking facilities are available in the vicinity of Winter Wonders for the duration of the event. Shared bikes can be hired via Villo! and the multiple shared mobility application. More than 800 underground cycle parking spaces, accessible 24 hours a day by lift or staircase, are available at Bourse and De Brouckère stations. Access to the secure spaces is via a €30/year subscription linked to the Mobib card. Non-secure parking spaces are also available for occasional use.

Parking of scooters and shared bikes is prohibited on the event route. Drop zones are available. The use of scooters is prohibited on the Vismet during the five weeks of the event.

The event is accessible by car (if there is no other alternative). In order to avoid any inconvenience, we strongly advise you to navigate with Waze or Google Maps to a Park & Ride zone (Ceria or Crainhem) for €3 or free if you have a STIB/De Lijn ticket. These zones will be free of charge during the Winter Wonders weekends (24/11 - 1/1). From there, the heart of Winter Wonders is only 20 minutes away by metro.

We strongly recommend that you follow the signs indicating free parking areas and park your vehicle in an Interparking area outside the pentagon: Rogier, Albertine, Poelaert, Loi (special rate of ≤ 6 from 7 pm until 5 am - or ≤ 5.40 for Pcard holders) and Passage 44 ($\leq 10/24$ h or ≤ 9 for Pcard holders, and ≤ 6 between 7 pm and 5 am - or ≤ 5.40 for Pcard holders).

The area around the Vismet will become a restricted area during peak hours: Friday to Sunday from 4 pm to 11 pm. This restricted area is only accessible to local residents with a sticker, tra ers and people with reduced mobility, thanks to two filter zones.

The various points mentioned above will be integrated into the dynamic plan of Winter Wonders.

PRM AT THE HEART OF OUR CONCERNS

For many years, here too the City of Brussels has paid particular attention to persons of reduced mobility and has implemented every means to ensure them easy access to the entire site of Winter Wonders.

The metro stations Gare Centrale, Bourse, De Brouckère and Sainte-Catherine are equipped with lifts to allow PRM to easily reach the heart of the event.

The Interparking Ecuyer, Monnaie, Brucity and De Brouckère have adapted parking spaces and lifts.

Parking spaces are also reserved for PRMs throughout the city and in off-street car parks.

The toilets in place on the event route are accessible to persons of reduced mobility with the help of specially designed, and tailored ramps.

The same applies to the skating rink and the Big Wheel, which has a cabin adapted for wheelchairs.

The flooring and the cable passageways are adapted to facilitate everyone's movement.

CLEANLINESS, AN IMPORTANT ISSUE

There are sorting areas for traders at each site. Brussels Major Events asbl, managing organiser of the event, will provide a team to transport the waste from the chalets' traders to the areas equipped for this purpose and separate them correctly. Traders can how have used oiled collected in collaboration with OlioBox. This helps prevent the creation of residual waste and allows the oil used to be recycled. Nearly 150 waste bins in the form of sorting islands are deployed at the various Winter Wonders sites. Teams from the Cleaning Service of the City are on hand during this period to ensure that the public enjoy the event in all its glory. The course is cleaned every day by mechanised teams. The Grand-Place, Bourse, De Brouckère, and Vismet zones will be cleaned simultaneously from 6:30 am.

When the chalets are opened, teams on foot will take over the site cleaning and the emptying of public dustbins. During the week, teams will be on site until 8 pm and until 10 pm at weekends.
